

## SECTION 00020 INVITATION TO BID

The City Council of Winner, South Dakota, will receive sealed bids for their Lift Station Improvements Project until **2:00 PM on Tuesday, February 20, 2018**, at the office of the Finance Officer, in the City Hall located at 325 South Monroe Street in Winner, South Dakota. Received sealed bids will be publicly opened and read aloud at the above place and time.

The major elements associated with the Lift Station Improvements are:

1. Remove and replace siding soffit and fascia.
2. Remove and replace building sill plate.
3. Remove pumps, piping, fittings, valves and related items.
4. Furnish and install two pump assemblies.
5. Furnish and install piping, fittings, valves, flow meters, pressure sensing rings, pipe supports sump pump and related items.
6. Remove and replace the control panel and related items.
7. Remove and replace wet well access hatches.
8. Provide core drilling, seals and pipe connections.
9. Replace existing light fixtures and exhaust fan.
10. Replace corroded ventilation duct work.
11. Coordinate with SCADA system provider.
12. Operate bypass pumping necessary during lift station downtime.

The approximate quantities mentioned above are subject to increase or decrease. It will be agreed by bidders that all quantities of work will be performed in accordance with the provisions of the plans and specifications and at the unit price bid. Bidders agree to furnish all labor, material, and equipment necessary to complete all the work as shown in the plans and specifications.

The complete set of Contract Documents, including drawings and specifications, are on file with the Finance Officer, Winner, South Dakota and/or at the office of Schmucker, Paul, Nohr and Associates, 2100 North Sanborn Blvd, Mitchell, South Dakota 57301. Paper copies of the contract documents and plans can be ordered with a non-refundable payment of \$30 plus applicable sales taxes. The contract documents and plans will also be made available at the SPN web site [www.spn-assoc.com](http://www.spn-assoc.com) with a non-refundable payment of \$20. Upon request, one copy of the contract documents and plans will be furnished at no charge as required by SDCL 5-18B-1 to each contractor who is a South Dakota resident and who intends to bid the project.

Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check or bank draft payable to the order of the City of Winner, South Dakota, in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the total bid. A bid bond in an amount equal to ten percent (10%) of the total bid will be accepted in lieu of a certified check or bank draft. Surety for bid bond must be authorized to do business in the State of South Dakota.

Pursuant to State Law, a copy of the bidder's sales and use tax license and a copy of the bidder's excise tax license as issued by the State of South Dakota must accompany the bid. In lieu of a copy of the license, the bidder shall submit appropriate evidence that the bidder and all affiliates have the appropriate licenses.

Bidders are advised that any contracts awarded on these projects will be partially funded by the United States Department of Agriculture, Rural Development and the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. All winning contractors and/or subcontractors must be registered in the System for Award Management (SAM) prior to beginning work on this project.

All requirements of the above-listed agency for construction projects will be required of all contractors and/or subcontractors performing work on this project. Neither the United States nor any of its

departments, agencies, or employees is or will be a party to this Invitation for Bids or any resulting contract. This procurement will be subject to EPA regulations contained in 40 CRR 35.936, 35.938 and 35.939.

Bidders on this work will be required to comply with Title 40 CFR 35.936-7 Title 40 CFR 33 and Executive Order 12138. The goals and other requirements for bidders and contractors under this regulation which concerns utilization of disadvantaged/minority business enterprises are explained in Part I of these Contract Documents.

**NOTICE OF REQUIREMENT FOR AFFIRMATIVE  
ACTION TO ENSURE EQUAL EMPLOYMENT  
OPPORTUNITY (EXECUTIVE ORDER 11246)**

The Bidder's attention is called to the "Equal Opportunity Clause" and the "Standard Federal Equal Employment Opportunity Construction Contract Specifications". The requirements for bidders and Contractors under this order are explained in Part I of these Contract Documents.


Section 746 of Title VII of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2017 (Division A - Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2017) applies an American Iron and Steel requirement to this project. All iron and steel products used in this project must be produced in the United States. The term "iron and steel products" means the following products made primarily of iron or steel: lined or unlined pipes and fittings, manhole covers and other municipal castings, hydrants, tanks, flanges, pipe clamps and restraints, valves, structural steel, reinforced precast concrete, and construction materials.

Bidders are also reminded that not less than the minimum wages as determined by the Davis-Bacon Act and set forth in the Contract Documents must be paid on this project and that the contractor and/or subcontractor must ensure that employees and applicants for employment are not discriminated against because of their race, color, religion, sex or natural origin.

Bidders on this work will be required to comply with the President's Executive Order Nos. 11246 (Equal Employment) as amended, 11518 (Small Business Concerns), and 11625 (MBE) as amended. The requirements for bidders and contractors under these orders are explained in the specifications.

In addition to all of the above-listed Federal requirements for work on this project, compliance with the contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, Executive Order 11375, Copeland Act, the Clean Air Act, and Water Pollution Control Act and subsequent amendments to all of the above will be required of contractors and/or subcontractors performing work on these projects.

Bids may be held by the City Council for a period of not more than thirty (30) days from the date of opening of bids for the purpose of reviewing the bids, investigating the qualifications of the bidders and completing financial arrangements prior to awarding the Work. The Owner reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive any informalities in the bidding and make awards to the Owner's best interest.
